The AACI high school sports medicine competition quiz bowl is a “Jeopardy Style” event.

Categories: 10 categories for the quiz bowl.

First Round - Up to eight teams in a first round/group round can compete. Five (5) categories with five (5) questions each. Within the twenty-five (25) questions will be one (1) “Medical Double” question (See below)

Point Amounts round one: 100, 200, 300, 400, 500.

Second Round - Up to eight teams in a first round/group round can compete. Five (5) categories with five (5) questions each. Within the twenty-five (25) questions will be one (1) “Medical Double” question (See below)

Point Amounts round one: 200, 400, 600, 800, 1000.

Final Round – points wagered (see below)

Awards Round - points wagered (see below)

“Medical Double” (instead of Daily Double) question only the team that selected that category/amount gets to play the question. The team will then choose a number amount to wager, ranging from 0 to the total they have accumulated. When the question is read, they have the usual amount of time to provide an answer. If they are correct, they receive the amount they wagered; if they are incorrect, they lose that amount, and no other team gets a chance to try.

Categories could be but are not limited to: First Aid, Emergency Procedures, **Shoulder Complex, Upper Extremity**, Anatomy, Physiology, Rehabilitation, Diagnostics, Ethics, Viruses, BBP, Environmental Conditions, Nutrition, Legal Aspects, Policies & Procedures, Pharmaceuticals, etc.

The questions will range from easy to hard, with the hardest questions being worth the most points on the board.

The questions will be written and stated in standard question format. The team that “Buzzes-in” first will have 10 seconds to answer the question.

Group Stage

Starting first round

Each team will consist of three students and have a buzzer on their table.

A random team will be asked to start by choosing a category and point amount. The question will be read by the coordinator and the first team who buzzes in gets 10 seconds to answer the question.

Discussion between teammates is allowed. Whoever buzzes first and gives a correct answer within the 10 seconds, will earn the point value of that question. If the wrong answer is given, they'll lose that value. If the team gets it wrong, the other teams are given a chance to answer. The team who gives the correct answer gains control of the board and chooses the next category and point value.

Starting the second round.

When all categories in the first round are used up, the board has five new categories and the following point values: 400, 800, 1,200, 1,600 and 2,000. Pick one more "Medical Double" question from the question sheet. Play the second round just like the first round.

Starting Final Round

At the end of the second round, any team with a positive score plays in the Final Round. The teams will be given a category and will be asked to wager any point value up to their current score on a note card. Absolutely no "Crossing out" of this number once written. After wagers have been made, the question will be read, and the teams are allowed 30 seconds to write down an answer. At which point the teams will turn in their notecards to the coordinator and leave the room.

Points will be added or deducted to their overall score based on their answer and wager.

At the end of all "Group Stages" The Award round will begin.

"Unsportsmanlike" point deductions

"Sportsmanship is an understanding of and commitment to fair play, ethical behavior and integrity, and general goodwill toward an opponent. It is an affirmation that a student is disciplined enough to have perspective, maintain poise and do what is best for his or her teammate."

All student competitors are expected to abide by the "Sportsmanship code" above.

Unsportsmanlike penalties (negative points) will be levied if the test coordinator(s) witnesses unsportsmanlike conduct by a team/teammate towards others during the Quiz Bowls Group stages and Final Round. First infraction, a team will be warned by the official.

Minor infraction: -100 points

Major infraction: -500 points

Severe infraction - Disqualification from Quiz Bowl.

This rule is set into place with the hope of not being utilized moving forward.

AWARD ROUND

The three teams with the top overall points will be asked to attend the award ceremony. They will quietly be handed a note card with their total team points awarded at the end of the group round. However, they will only know their own total points.

While at the awards ceremony, the final question will be asked. The teams will then be given one last question topic and asked to wager any point value up to their current score on the note card. Absolutely no "Crossing out" of this number once written. After wagers have been made, the question will be read, and the teams are allowed 30 seconds to write down an answer. At which time the teams will turn in their notecards to the coordinator. The coordinator or a representative will then read the question and give the correct answer. Then the coordinator will then review the answers and points wagered by all three teams.

Points will be added or deducted to their overall score based on their answer and wager.

The team with the top overall points will be crowned champion.

Sudden death tie breaker

If for some reason at least two of the teams have the same number of points, for the championship, a final question will be asked. The first team to answer correctly will be named the champion, or if a team answers incorrectly they will be deemed the loser.
